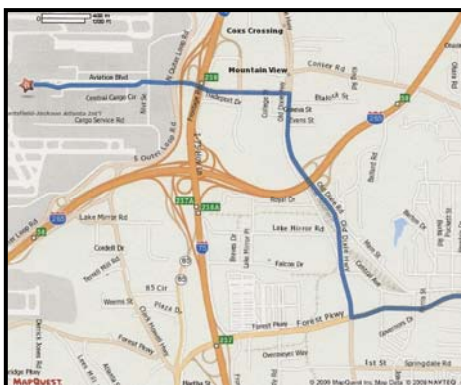
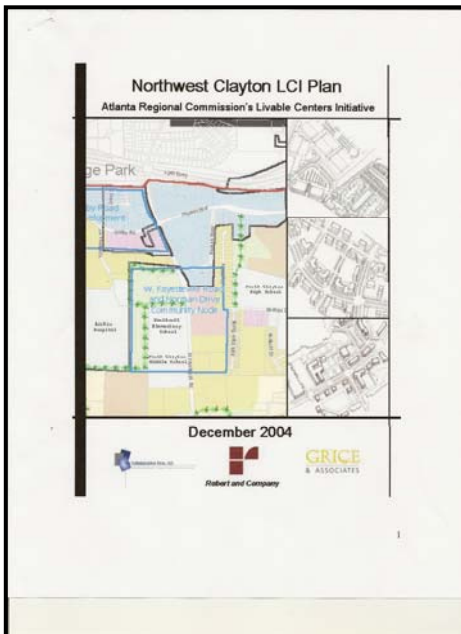
Lemongrass Consulting has experienced urban planners and can conduct transportation planning studies.

In 2004, Clovia Hamilton assisted with the development of the DeKalb County Transportation Plan; and developing the transportation elements of the comprehensive development plans for Clayton County, the City of Jonesboro, Forest Park, and Riverdale. In preparing the Clayton County Comprehensive Development Plan Transportation Element, complied with the new Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) rules. The Plan was adopted by the Clayton County Commission and approved by the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) and DCA.

Clovia was also responsible for assisting with the transportation improvement portions of the Oakland/Lakewood Livable Centers Initiative (LCI), NW Clayton LCI, Upperwestside LCI, Beltline Tax Allocation District (TAD), Ponce/Moreland Corridors, and Braves Traffic studies.

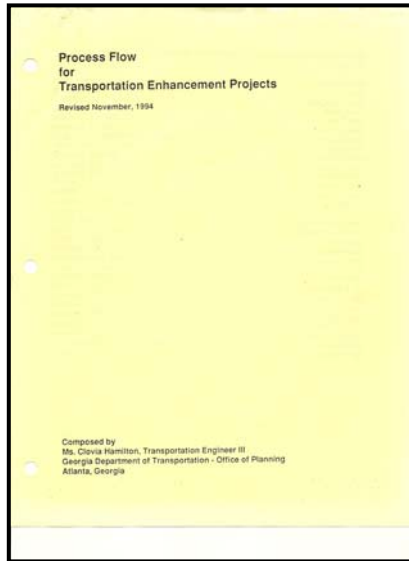
Clovia Hamilton has worked for the **Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)** in Atlanta, GA:

- Provided review comments on the Georgia Department of Transportation's Commuter Rail/ Intercity Rail Action Plan.
- Monitored public transportation and urban planning (TIP, UPWP) for Columbus, Savannah, Brunswick and Albany. Served as the Statewide Military Base Transportation Planning Liaison with the Military Traffic Management Command (MTMC).
- Managed 55 Process Reviews related to specifications interpretation for asphalt and portland cement concrete pavements, aggregate sampling and testing, steel and iron certification, thermoplastic pavement markings, and traffic signal operations. Process reviews also involved program amendments, processing contractor payments, design exceptions, and construction practices.



Clovia Hamilton also served as a Principal Planner for the **City of Atlanta's Department of Planning** and Neighborhood Conservation (1995-1997)

- Managed the City's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Prioritized 300 proposed transportation projects on the basis of economic development, safety, project readiness, impacts to natural and historic resources, and multimodalism.
- Served as a member of the Atlanta Regional Commission's Transportation Coordination Committee (ARC TCC) and advised Mayor Bill Campbell on agenda items for upcoming ARC Transportation Air Quality Committee (TAQC) and board meetings.
- Served as the Department's liaison to the City Council's transportation, environmental, and utility committees.
- Evaluated proposed zoning changes, traffic impact studies, street abandonments, parking permit requests, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) proposals.
- Assisted with the transportation planning for the 1996 Olympic Games.

Clovia was also a Transportation Engineer in the **Georgia Department of Transportation's Statewide Planning Division.**

- Was responsible for regulatory compliance with the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA). Helped establish and manage Georgia's Transportation [Environmental] Enhancement Activities (TEA) program with 90 proposed projects valued at \$62 Million.
- Served as transportation planner for 28 counties in east-central Georgia (District 2 Tennille). Researched traffic counts, traffic control devices, accident data, road characteristics, socioeconomic data, and politics.
- Provided the local governments and transportation professionals training about the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).
- Served as Chief of Georgia's federal functional classification office. Served as a liaison to the Federal Highway Administration.
